- Service delivery failures: -

We have a list of 14 enforcements which require addressing by planning and have asked for a substantive update. At the moment we have a holding-response but am encouraged to have a new cabinet member and some engagement. We'll happily share insights with other towns and parishes.

We have provided a list of 13 persistent highways defects to our LAT to get into the program of works.

We are working with our unitary councillor to follow up with repeat failure on bin collections -- particularly green waste -- and poor communications from the officers. We understand this to be a widespread issue, and would happily join our voice with other towns and parishes to be heard. Perhaps the Community Board would pick this up.

- Planning: -

It is a relatively quiet period for planning with a few large applications stuck in the process and many others running late. Questions as to, the planning department apparently ignoring

- Community Improvements: -

We are excited to be starting major renovations at King George's Field with the aim of increasing health and wellbeing in the community -- particularly addressing social isolation in the community with an aging population and covid isolation. First step is the conversion of the old Guide Hut into a health and fitness studio with classes for all, and then looking at improving the cafe and kids' facilities as well as sporting upgrades and car parking improvements. We will need Community Board support for these improvements and the trustees put in an application three months ago. We are finding it hard to get help to improve the dangerous road situation and would appreciate Community Board help in getting this moving.

- Crime:-

There seems to be an increase with more reports of anti-social behaviour, including drug-dealing and this week a gang of youths fighting. We are liaising with our Iver-based Sergeant but we appear forgotten at a higher level. We would welcome more engagement from Police in the Community Board. We are progressing plans for CCTV in the village, learning with the help of GX and Ivers. Again, we would appreciate support from others

- Road safety.

We have had two crashes with walls destroyed and one parent having to grab a child out of the way of a car mounting the pavement in the past month. However, we are struggling to get Bucks to agree that the package of road safety improvements that we are proposing to have privately funded in a S106 agreement is needed. We would appreciate support from the Community Board in making the case for protecting our residents from through-traffic.
