# The Role of the Community Boards

## Our Vision:

- To proactively support council priorities at a very local level, and in a way which is the best fit for that local community.
- To connect the council with community groups, partners and residents to understand what matters to them and work together to problem solve.

## Community Boards will:

- Support the council's strategic priorities at a local level through delivery and funding of local projects and initiatives.
- Make recommendations on the allocation of Community Board funding to deliver agreed local priorities (aligned with Buckinghamshire Council policy and priorities).
- Identify and agree local priorities based on local data and insight, community intelligence and feedback from their community. This will inform and direct an action plan based on evidence of local need.
- Set up action groups to support the delivery of their local action plans.
- Provide opportunities to ensure the local community is able to respond to consultations and influence changes or prioritisation of local services in a timely manner.

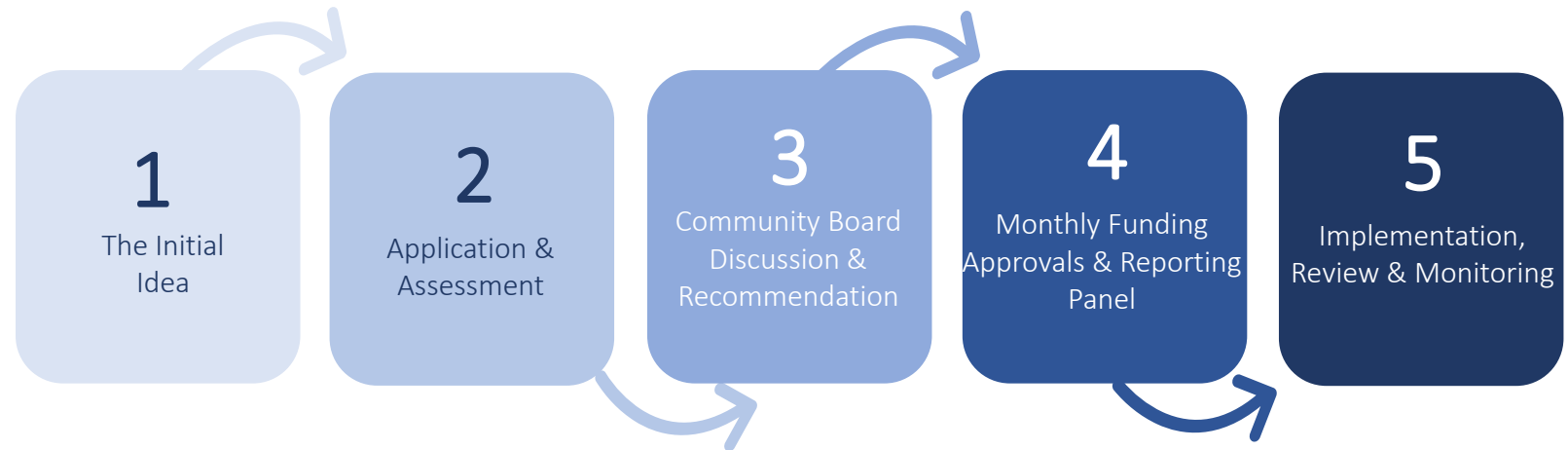

## Budget Overview

- Total budget for 2020/21: £319,716
- Total amount carried forward: £261,072
- **Budget for 2021/22: £211,482 + £261,072=£472,554**
- Priority spending: 15% on Environment and 15% on Economic Recovery (15%=£70,883)
- 25% (£52,870) on Highways



- *An idea comes to the Board via a meeting, web application, or conversation with Chair / Coordinator*
- *Internal due diligence and application checks are done by Coords / Localism Managers*
- *Application to the board to check relevance, and it meets priorities. Indicative voting shows support*
- *Formal approval by Service Director / Cabinet Member. Monthly reporting helps clarify spend and themes.*
