

Notice of Review of Polling Districts and Polling Places

The Electoral Review and Administration Act 2013

“Additional information on the review”

- The Returning Officer for the Aylesbury and Buckingham Constituencies will comment on the proposed polling stations.
- There will be a period of public consultation on the Returning Officer’s draft proposals to allow interested parties to make further representations.
- Any person or organisation commenting on a polling place/station is encouraged to suggest an alternative and give reasons for the alternative proposal in order that it may be given appropriate consideration.
- The Council will produce final proposals for the new polling districts and places. The final proposals will be made after taking into consideration all representations made.
- The Council must agree the proposals. Once they are agreed they will be made available to the public.
- The review does not cover the boundaries of the parliamentary constituencies or the borders of Aylesbury Vale District Council. It also does not include District Ward or Parish boundaries.
- All submissions, correspondence, minutes of Council meetings and decisions relating to the review will be made public as the review progresses.
- It is expected that the Council’s final decisions on the review will be made in late 2019, in time for the publication of the new Electoral Registers on 1 December 2019.

Definition of terms

Polling District: The geographical area created by the division of a Parliamentary Constituency, a Division or a Ward into smaller parts within which a polling place can be determined which is convenient to electors.

Polling Place: The building or geographical area in which a Polling Station will be located.

Polling Station: The room or building (including temporary accommodation such as a caravan) where the poll actually takes place.
