Community Boards are all about bringing Buckinghamshire Council, community groups and residents together to improve local areas and everyone is invited to get involved, suggest ideas and work collaboratively to make a real difference.

All the latest from your area

In an exciting first year, we have supported a whole range of projects including ...

- Creation of a sensory garden in Holmer Green
- Support for Citizens Advice to provide a debt counsellor for our area
- Funding for Missendens Walled Gardens to enable them to put in place a 'Train the Trainer' scheme which will help them become less reliant on funding for training in the future
- Bee Friendly Garden Design competition for local schools, focusing on the environment and supporting the pollinators in our gardens



Getting Involved...

We have a number of action groups and welcome new members who can help inform and deliver our projects. You don't need to sign up for life! Let us know if you have ideas for projects in the following areas and want to come along to a future meeting...

Environment

We are already working on some exciting projects, thinking about the climate crisis and making the environment more attractive for important pollinators:

Ecoliteracy Board

- Has been installed on the Prestwood Scouts hut in Prestwood Common
- Is designed to help us remember the impact of littering in the Natural World

Bee Friendly School Garden Competition

- We are collaborating with schools in the Parish to who will be participating
- A local ecologist will be presenting at each participating school in January.
- Designs will be evaluated in April 2022 and prizes awarded

Bee Squared Initiative

- We at the Missendens Environment Action Group are working with teams from Hazlemere, High Wycombe, Chesham and Amersham on an initiative to involve the public in broadening our county pollinator corridors to help our pollinators thrive.
 - This project is expected to run in March - April 2022

New support for voluntary & community organisations in Buckinghamshire

Does your charity or voluntary group need help to thrive and grow? A new service offering support, guidance and training to charities, voluntary and community groups and social enterprises (not-for-profit groups) is now available.

Delivered by local charity Community Impact Bucks and funded by Buckinghamshire Council, the VCSE (Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise) Support Service provides free help with all aspects of running a charity or voluntary group including starting up, leadership, funding, and volunteer recruitment and management, with priority given to those with income of less than £100,000. Tailored support ensures each organisation can get the help that they need.

Getting support is easy: to get help for your organisation or, if you know of an organisation that would benefit from our support, fill in the short request form and a member of the Support team will be in touch.

Bucks Adult Learning - Courses available throughout November...

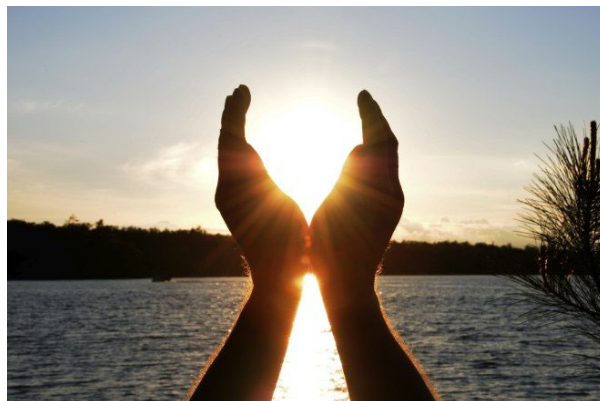
...covering a range of topics that include managing stress and anxiety, improving your wellbeing and employability skills workshops. These can also be found on our [website](#).
