



Number of respondents living in Aylesbury








Demographics

Gender identity of respondents




Respondents by ethnicity




Education and Employment


Education/Employment status of respondents



How respondents feel their school experience could be improved




Skills respondents reported they would like to learn

Areas of Aylesbury Young People like or would like to see improved

"Central Aylesbury as I know that it has a high crime rate and lowering it down I think would make a lot of people a more comfortable to visit or even the people who already live there"


"Bedgrove Park could be improved and many things are run down and old, we have lots spare areas where could be used in Bedgrove park"

"I like the Aqua vale park"


Health and Physical Activity

Types of movement respondents engage in each week




"We need more things to do for teenagers such as more skateparks or pump tracks this would mean less anti social behaviour as teens have something to do and are not bored"

Activities respondents would like to do in green spaces




Stresses reported by respondents




How often respondents feel heard/listened



How conscious young people are of their body image




Number of respondents who feel they have control over their own wellbeing

> "I walk to school and the roads are very busy around the Grange & Grammar Schools, too many cars dropping off when they could walk."


"Busy roads constantly, too many traffic lights, road works everywhere all the time"
