Putlowes Road & Putlowes Drive	
Do you support the Proposals?	Comments
Yes	<p>I would very like to be restricted , at the first section as u come of A41 when cars are parked they narrow the road to much specially when they do a silly parking too, as continuing pass Putlowes drive junction when cars stopped there leaves tons of rubbish like McD and other snacks , it's disgusting , some teenagers stops frequently just to smoke weeds spreading the " flavor " everywhere sometimes depends of wind I have to close my windows as I can't stand that **** .</p> <p>Thank you for understanding</p>
Yes	<p>You are cutting off the only free access to the waddesdon greenway. Many of us do not want to have to pay to park at the station, it's typical that a leisure asset is provided and then a charge for using it is foisted on us. Shame on you !</p>
Yes	<p>I have visited the site today and spoke with a number of the residents, those that live on the approach to the farm do not seem to have too much of a problem with vehicles parking along this length of carriageway as the farmer requires the whole of the road width with his agricultural vehicles. I understand that a number of these houses are owned by HS2 and those residents who rent these houses have some conditions placed upon their front gardens should they be required by HS2, picture of the road concerned below with access to the farm over the cattlegrid;</p> <p>I also spoke with the residents who reside almost adjacent to the gates which accesses the Greenway shown below;The residents who live at this location have a number of issues, on weekends and holidays when the weather is good cars park on both sides of the road which mean that their access is used as a turnaround point or they have to reverse which is unsafe. It would appear during these busy periods dogs are off leads and toddlers are allowed free reign on the road which again is very unsafe as this road is open to vehicular traffic.</p> <p>Information regarding ant-social behaviour such as the smoking of weed takes place periodically. It would also appear that some commuters also park at this location in order to park for free instead of the paid parking at the station.</p> <p>The issue of blue light services getting to these residences would be compromised during the busy periods as was pointed out by these residents</p> <p>My concern about this proposal is where any of these vehicles on busier days will park, they could be displaced into inappropriate locations near to the entrance or on the grass verges on the A41 with children and dogs being guided into this road.</p> <p>I would suggest that wayfinding signs are placed in appropriate places indicating where parking is available so that this may mitigate any inconsiderate parking.</p>

	In conclusion [REDACTED] do not object to these proposals but ask that the comments made are taken into consideration. The enforcement of waiting restrictions lie with the local highway authority or its nominated contractor.
Not Answered	As a regular cyclist along the Greenway I agree that the presence of cars can be dangerous and also must be frustrating for the residents. I wonder if a few parking bays could be considered as it may be useful for those with mobility issues, who may wish to use the Greenway but can't walk as far.
No	It provides free unlimited access to park to enjoy a lovely open resource desperately needed in these times for mental wellness
No	The only other place to park where you can access the start of the Greenway at the Aylesbury end is the station which, apart from Sundays, incurs a charge. At a time when people should be encouraged to exercise more why make it more difficult by stopping them from accessing this wonderful asset? I have never encountered any difficulties parking here, today I was the only vehicle. If there are issues then why a blanket ban? Why not make parking for a maximum of three hours and on one side only?
No	Where are users of the greenway supposed to park then. The train station carpark is the only other alternative, but user of that car park are supposed to be reserved to the train passengers, plus incurs a parking fee Monday to Saturday. You want people to be active well this is t going to help!!!
