Item 7: Priority & Funding Update

Active Travel- Getting around in Aylesbury

Uses car as son has autism

Nan drove- I broke my leg. I sold my bike to get some money.

Bus Routes are good

Meadowcroft- I have a bus pass so use buses. Have walked too. Can't cycle due to disability.

Disabled so taxi or bus

Stoke Mandeville- don't walk as roads too busy and doesn't feel safe



Crossing closure at Old Stoke Road means we can't walk to local shops and more.

Likes that a lot of children at Ashmead school walk but those parents who drive are inconsiderate.

I drive- injuries mean I can no longer cycle. Have bus pass but usually only come to town to do bulk shop which is too much to carry

E-scooters unsafe when walking. People park cars on pavements too.

Active Travel- Getting around in Aylesbury

Bedgrove- number 7 bus is great- please don't cut service.

Walked from Bicester Road

Drives- buses not reliable from Aston Clinton

I walked from canal today. I like that I could get a bus if I needed to.

Elmhurst- I walk. Overgrown Yew tree (private land) on Buckingham Road makes pavement too narrow though

Would use Greenway for walking if cheaper to get to Parkway (£4 on train from town)

Lack of safe cycle racks prevents me from cycling. Need one on Market Square

Works at BC- likes cycle racks as secure. Also takes bus

Car shares to work and walks home

Likes that Bucks has good public footpaths in countryside

£15,000 - Aylesbury Town Council- Flood Trailer

£2,190 - UK Astronomy Planetarium

£4,368 - Ukraine Friends and Family Hub @ The Vineyard

£23,778 - Active in the Community Youth Project

Remaining Budget: **£161,791***

What's new?

-Small Grants of up to £1,000

-Maximum value £15,000 for general funding

-Must have contributory funding for requests over £1,000

-Majority of projects to be grown from within board priorities

-New highways contract from April 2023
