

Beeches Community Board Action Plan 2022-23

Introduction:

The Beeches Community Board covers the parishes of Burnham, Dorney, Farnham Royal, Stoke Poges and Taplow. The aim of the Board is to improve outcomes for residents through ensuring strong connections between Buckinghamshire Council and the local community. This will be achieved by ensuring that Board members are able to make recommendations on local issues, and that they can influence the Council's service design and delivery in the local area. The Board will also work in partnership with a range of local stakeholders to find solutions to local concerns.

This action plan sets out how the Beeches Community Board will work with the community to address community priorities and take action on local issues.

Aims:

- To develop good working relationships with the community to understand and address local issues
- To understand what is important to the Community Board area
- To develop action groups to explore key areas of focus and identify how to take action as a community
- To identify opportunities and projects that meet the Community Board priorities for funding, and to actively seek out local organisations that can deliver these projects in partnership with the Board
- To promote the Community Board and Community Board funding to the local community and encourage engagement
- To support the council in delivering strategic priorities at a local level
