**The Brill Playground Committee** was formed in June 2020 at the request of Brill Parish Council. The Committee, made up of parents and a grandparent living in Brill, was charged with managing a project to replace Brill's two playgrounds, both adjacent to the village playing fields. In the end, the Committee had to raise just over £146,000.

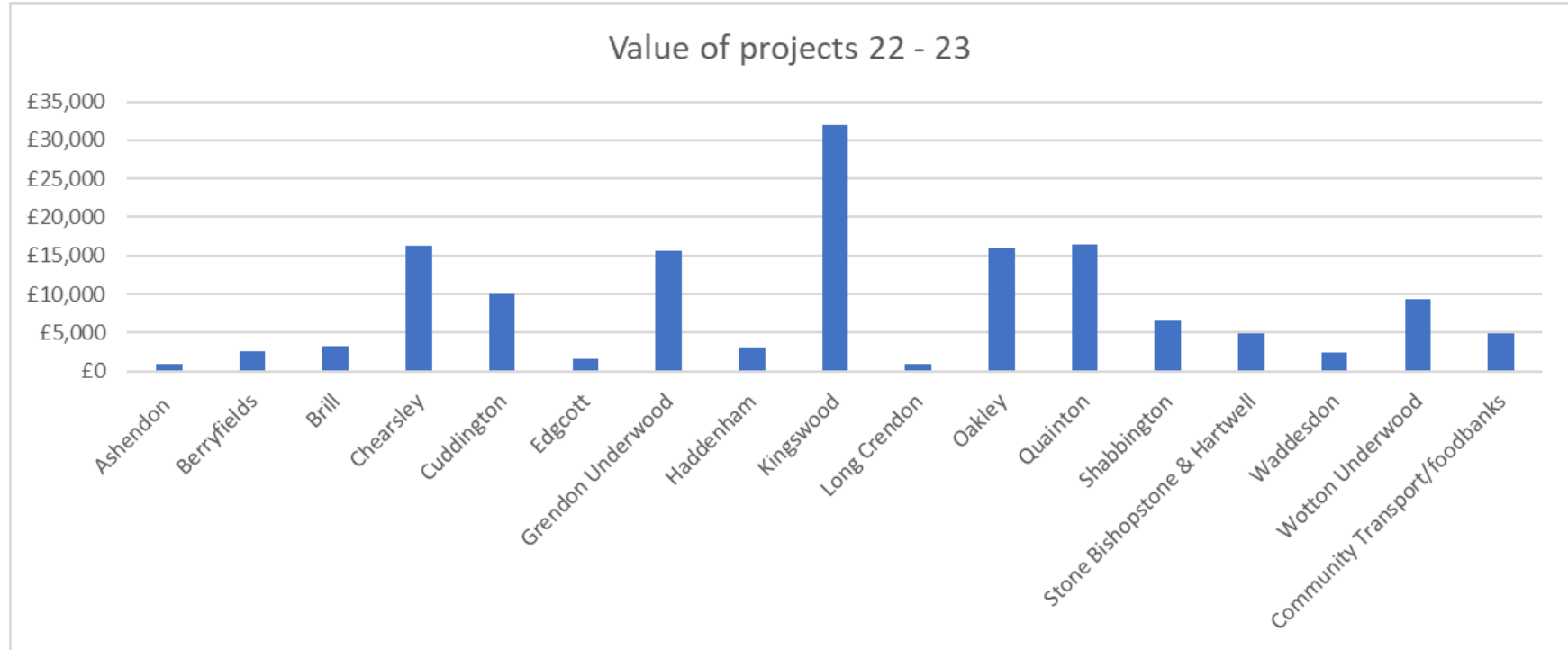

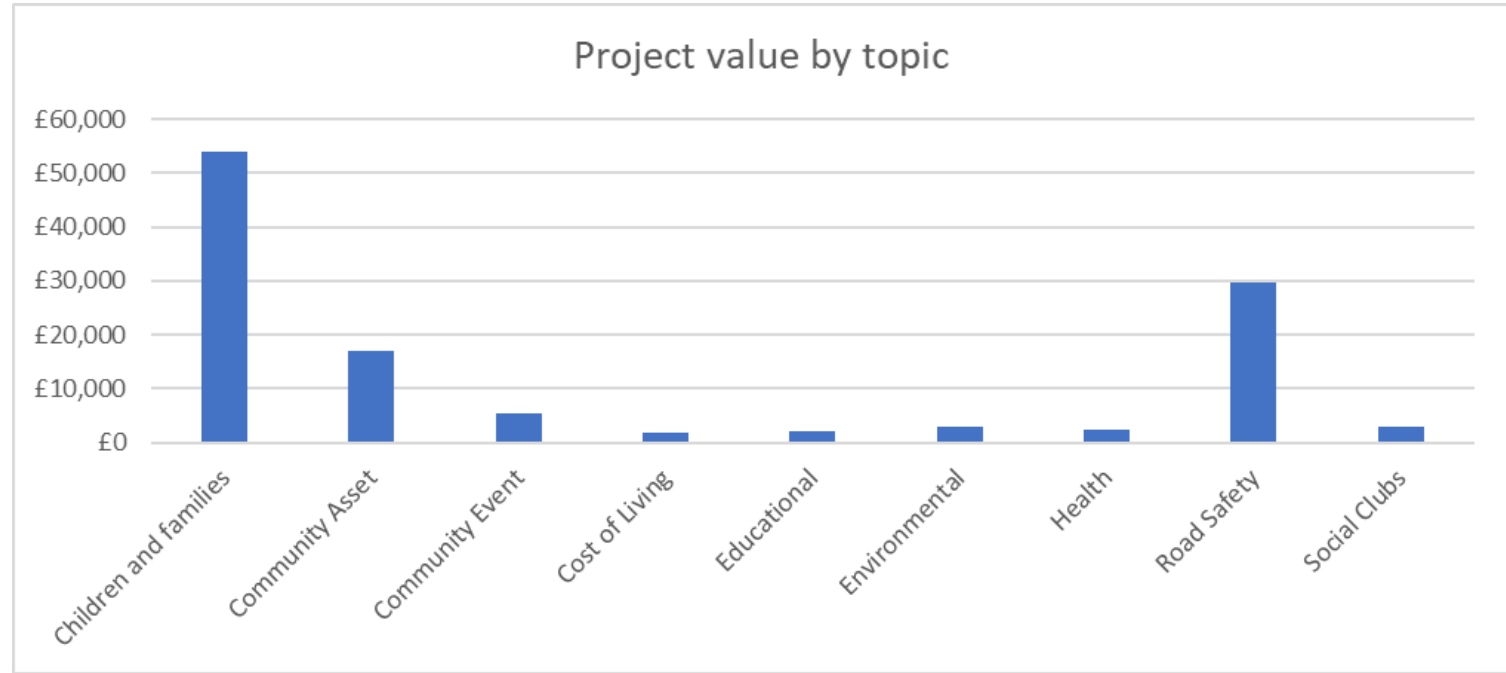

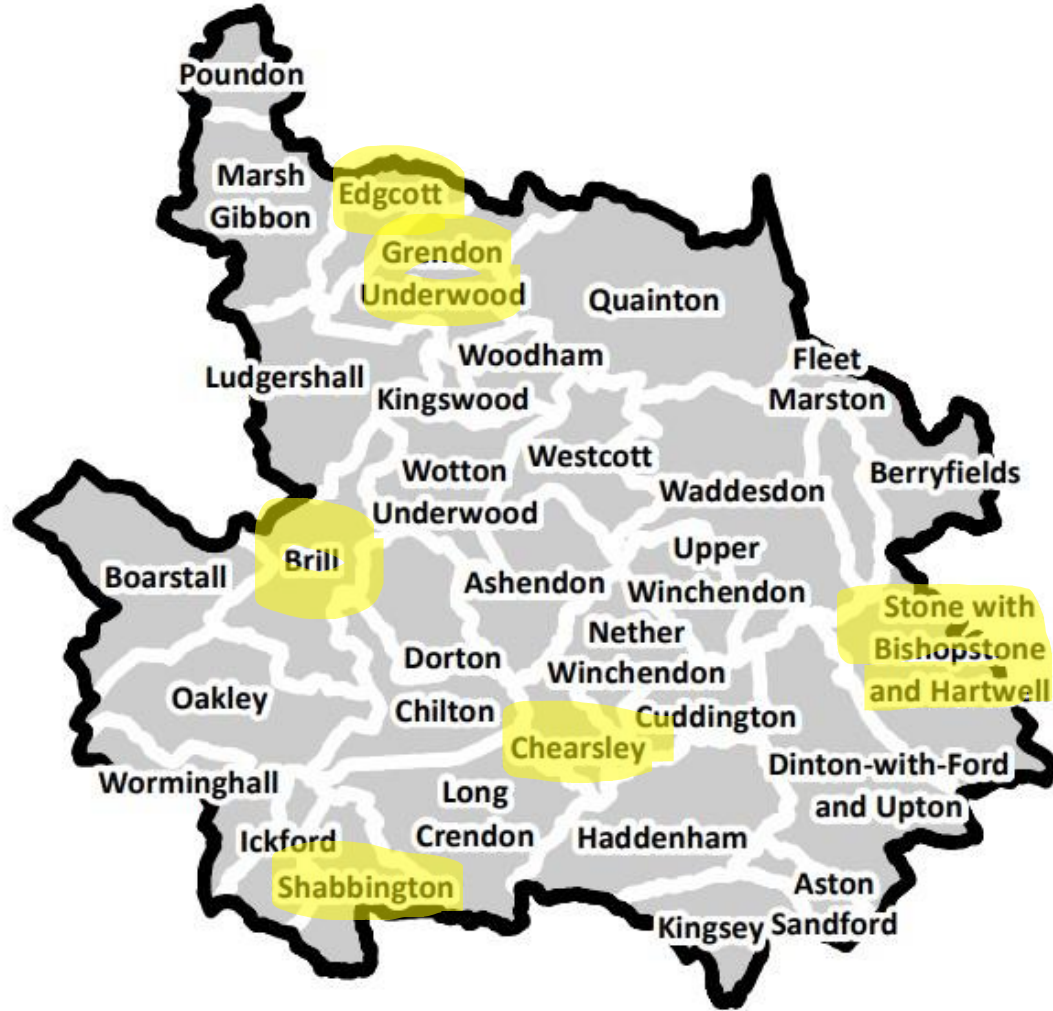
