**Update September 2023** 



## A Brief Introduction

**What is it?** - It is a library of things that people will be able to borrow for a minimal fee. We will provide a variety of equipment used for hobbies, sports, outdoor activities, domestic activities, DIY, etc. We have been liaising with the local community to find out what they would like us to stock and whether they have items they no longer want or would like to share.

**Where is it?** - Our huge storage container is now sited at Bucks Railway Centre in Quainton. People are able to collect from that venue by appointment and after booking their items.

Who can use the services? - Everyone!

**How can we use the service?** - We now have a website and are in the process of cataloging items on the Sharebee database, so that people can reserve and collect their items (just like a regular library) - items need to be returned after use.



**Silver Sunday** is the UK's national day for older people. **Grow it Cook it Eat** is a community food growing and cooking project, bringing communities together. Do you find buying fresh fruit and vegetables expensive or don't really know what to do with the ones you do buy? This project brings together communities who may experience financial hardship or have challenges accessing fresh fruit and vegetables together to provide spaces to use for your own growing and provide opportunities to improve your cooking skills

Projects that help reduce negative impacts on the environment and foster a greater appreciation of it. Zero Carbon Haddenham offer a range of schemes such as a garage sale safari! And the use of a Thermal Imaging Scanner to detect heat loss in homes.
