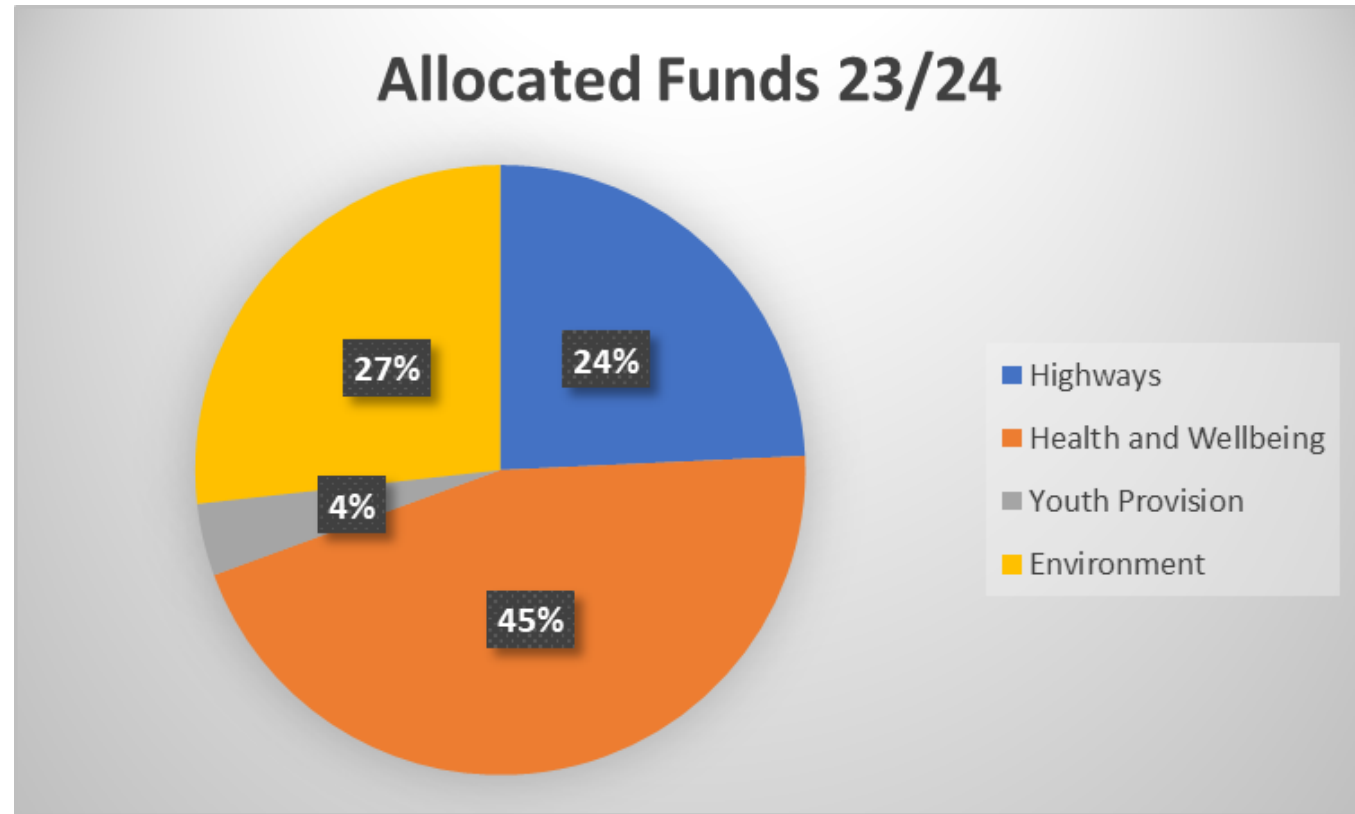

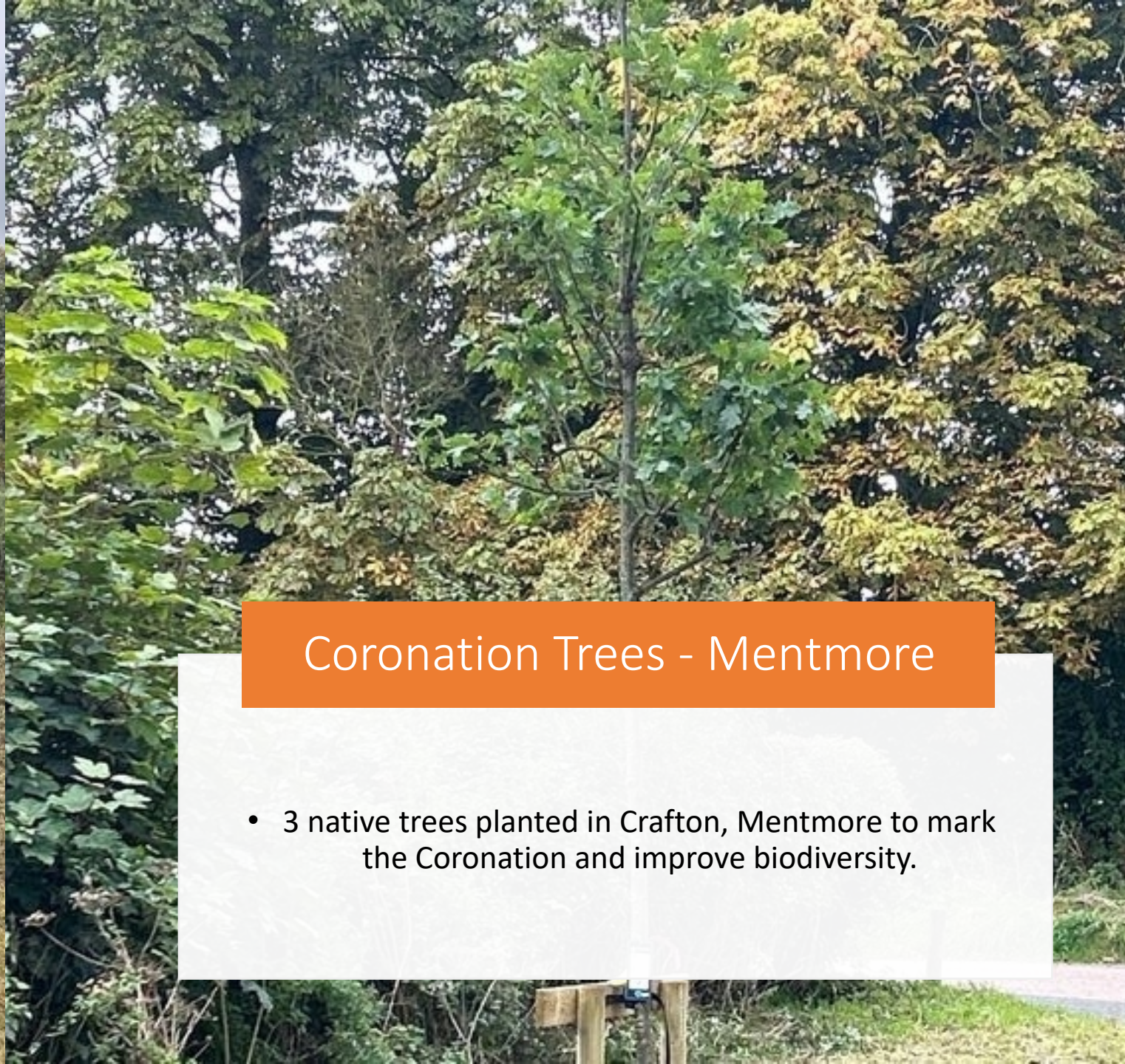

Wingrave – Hedgelaying Project idea

- Supporting sustainability by teaching local people a skill that is easily lost as places become more suburban

- New information boards with 50 species of mammal, bird, amphibian, insects and plants identified.

- Top spotting areas to be plotted

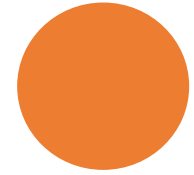


Mindfulness Junk Art Community Café (*Working Title*)

...repurposing obsolete pre-loved items for public good

Key Aims and Community Impact:

- **Supporting local communities Ivinghoe to Wing Ward with mindfulness-based wellbeing creative space**, run by qualified local art psychotherapist (Belinda Hunt) in conjunction with local Repair Café (Alex Razak) and Bucks Waste Re-Cycling (Ellie Powell)
- Supporting Mental Health across the community; reducing isolation and anxiety, (eg. for: hard-to-reach clients via Social Prescribers, GP practices and Warm Spaces, Churches, Hospices, Local Arts and wellbeing Charities) *as well as* via local community communiques/pages to reach the **whole** Community
- Engaging youth as well as older audiences; linking local Enterprise/Business, local Community and local Waste Management – supporting changing mindset to consumption and waste
- Reducing waste - utilising the 36% irreparable items brought to repair café and re-purposing as art items; offering a creative hub
- Supporting up-skilling in creative design and fabrication processes for all ages post 18 – feeding into Repair Café audience reach and growth – linking to new audiences for environmental, enterprise, problem solving, community impact
- Providing internship opportunity for post 16 candidate for social media/marcomms development and offering training in project design and realisation skills
- Creating not for profit arts in health/wellbeing opportunities across the villages; scalable to other Wards and to other Repair Cafes
- In the event that pilot not repeated or scaled up, all materials will be donated to Repair Cafe; BCC/PC for Social Enterprise projects or sold off and funds donated back to Community Board, as apt.
