This is a serious issue for the residents of Newton Leys specifically those without a car. It is extremely difficult to walk between Newton Leys and Stoke Hammond to vote; there are no footways, beside either road route. One route would require negotiating two major roundabouts and walking beside a dual carriageway with no footway, the alternative route would involve walking along busier local roads again with no footways. In addition there is no viable bus route between the two settlements.

Stoke Hammond Parish comprises two distinct settlements approximately 2 -3 miles apart; the village of Stoke Hammond itself, and the entirely separate South West part of the Newton Leys development on the edge of Milton Keynes but falling within the parish of Stoke Hammond and therefore within the Buckinghamshire Council area. The larger part of the Newton Leys development falls under Milton Keynes Council.

The Polling Place for the whole of Stoke Hammond Parish including the part of Newton Leys falling within that Parish is in Stoke Hammond village.

Whilst I was campaigning as a candidate in the last Buckinghamshire Elections in 2021 I realised that the lack of a suitably convenient Polling Place for Newton Leys was a serious issue for the residents, particularly those without a car, and this issue was frequently raised with me on the doorstep. It would be practically impossible to walk between Newton Leys and Stoke Hammond to vote; there are no footways, beside either road route. One route would require negotiating two major roundabouts and walking beside a dual carriageway with no footway, the alternative route would involve walking along busier local roads again with no footways.

There is no viable bus route between the two settlements.

The solution is clear- there needs to be a separate Polling Place for the Newton Leys Residents of Stoke Hammond Parish.

Following the Parliamentary and Local Government Boundary Reviews it makes perfect sense that Buckinghamshire Council review the polling places to ensure that they work with the future boundaries as well as a sensible exercise to do regularly to ensure that polling places are accessible, suitable and cost effective for the Council.

We understand that the Acting Returning Officer for the new Aylesbury constituency Nick Graham agrees with all of the proposals for the Aylesbury constituency. However, we have a few concerns that we feel need to be raised about some of the changes proposed and we have outlined below.

The proposed changes within the Aylesbury constituency that we agree with are (using the new polling district codes):

- AAM Olympic Lodge changed to Rivets Sports & Social Club, Whitehead Way
- AAV The Grange School changed to Aylesbury Tennis & Squash Club
- ABN Ewe Barn changed to The Village Swan, Ivinghoe Aston

• ABO Oakfield Community Building changed to Kingsbrook View Primary Academy – please note that there is a large increase in traffic at school drop off and pick up times and this may discourage people to vote at these times if clear signage about parking for voting is not made available

• AAK & AAU being split due to LGBC proposals and voting at Walton Court CC

• AAN polling districts being merged due to Parliamentary boundary changes and voting at Oakfield Scout Hut

• AAO due to LGBC and voting at Prebendal Farm CC

- AAQ polling districts being merged due to Parliamentary boundary changes and voting at Haydon Hill CC
- AAW due to LGBC proposals and voting at Walton Court CC
- ABX districts being merged due to Parliamentary boundary changes and voting at The School Room, 29/31 High Street, Weedon

The proposed changes that we would like to highlight our concerns about are:

DCG & ABV.

• We understand due to the LGBC proposals the existing polling district (ABD) had to be split to accommodate the two wards of Aylesbury South East and Wendover, Halton & Stoke

Mandeville and that due to Parliamentary boundary changes both DCH and DCG would be voting for the Mid Buckinghamshire constituency. Given that ABV and DCG will fall into the same ward for Buckinghamshire Council and Parish Council elections we think it would make sense for both polling districts to vote in the same polling place.

- At the last polling place review, we raised concerns about moving the polling place to Hawkslade Farm CC due to the fact that it is a long walk for those who don't have access to a car/lift to the polling station. We note that there is an option to cross the railway line which will cut down the journey, but as it involves crossing a railway line via a stile we do not think this is suitable for everyone and certainly not those that have mobility issues and use any form of mobility aid. We believe polling places as accessible as possible to ensure as many people who wish to vote in person are able to do so without facing access difficulties.
- As our view is that both polling districts should vote in the same polling place we accept that the walk to Hawkslade Community Centre is a likely more pleasant walk than to the Stoke Mandeville Community Centre due to the nature of the roads (a heavily trafficked B443 where the vehicles can travel at up to 40mph for sections) both would take around 15-20 minutes from the respective polling districts.
- There is no direct bus route from these polling districts to Hawkslade CC, only to Stoke Mandeville village which is further rationale as to why we don't think Hawkslade CC is the most suitable location.
- We understand there is a lack of community venues within the polling districts, but we would suggest that the use of Booker Park School may be an option, it has been used for community events in the past, is easily accessible on foot for the residents in both polling districts, there is parking onsite for those that may need assistance and it falls within the Stoke Mandeville parish. There is a history of small polling districts that are in different parliamentary seats voting in the same polling station so we don't think this would be a problem.

ABY

- Due to the LGBC proposals we understand the need to create two new polling districts, however part of the reasoning behind this change was the fact that ABY Aston Reach is not closely linked to Weston Turville so it would make no sense for that to continue as the polling station for the ward.
- To walk to Weston Turville from Aston Reach would at the quickest take approx. 40 minutes via New Road. However, New Road doesn't have a footpath for the whole length of the way and is a national speed limit road, with no street lighting, for a large part of the route where cars could be travelling 60mph.
- Although Bedgrove Pavilion is still a somewhat long walk, it takes approx. 25 mins but is within areas with footpaths the entire way with streetlights.
- There is no direct public transport option to get from Aston Reach to Weston Turville village, again one of the reasons behind the LGBC proposals for a change in the ward. We do not believe that Weston Turville Village Hall would be a suitable polling place.
- Our suggestion would be for Bedgrove Pavilion to be used for ABY being in the same Buckinghamshire Council ward, the venue is already in use, and it is safely accessible. Ideally, we would suggest a venue even closer for residents, but we understand that the cost of using the Holiday Inn may be too high and it may not be suitable due to it being a busy hotel and fitness centre.

DAC

• We understand due to the increase in the size of the electorate that the Family Centre in Berryfields Primary School may no longer be suitable. Roman Park is a fabulous local

facility; however we are concerned that the location could cause problems for people voting if they wish to walk to the venue as it is not central to the estate.

- Although the venue may be less than half a mile, suggesting it will take a 5 minute walk is optimistic at most, especially for those with mobility issues it could be at least double if not more. At the furthest point it could be upwards of a 20 minute walk.
- For those that will drive, there is limited parking at the venue while both schools have more parking individually as well as on street parking available.
- Would it be possible to use one of the other schools which are centrally located, have ample parking and are within easier walking distance for the majority of the ward?

Current Ward: Stone & Waddesdon

Changing from Berryfields Family Centre, Berryfields Primary School HP18 0FG to Roman Park Hall, Sir Henry Lee Crescent, HP18 0YT

The Aylebury Liberal Democrats note that the majority of the Berryfields Parish are on the opposite side of the main road from Roman Park and while the change in distance is not significant, moving all the polling districts to Roman park will deter some voters. We propose that one polling district remains in Berryfields Family centre.

Current Ward: Aston Clinton & Bierton

The Aylebury Liberal Democrats have no objections to moving the polling station from **The Oakfield Community Building, Siding Road, Kingsbrook HP22 7AY to Kingsbrook View Primary Academy, Kingsbrook Basin, Broughton, HP22 7EE Current Ward: Aylesbury South East**

AAI (NEW SPLIT) changes to **AAU** Aylesbury, Southcourt 3. Polling District changed to match the Local Government Boundary Commission's final proposal for Hawkslade Ward and Southcourt Ward for Aylesbury Town Council. Proposed polling place is Walton Court Community Centre, Walton Court Shopping Centre, Hannon Road, Aylesbury, Bucks. HP218TJ. Aylebury Liberal Democrats comments as follows: **Aylesbury Liberal Democrats support this proposed change.**

AAL - Aylesbury Oakfield changes to **AAN** Aylesbury, Oakfield as Current Polling Districts BEC and AAL merge since they are both now within the same parliamentary constituency boundaries and have the same Polling Place Aylesbury Liberal Democrats comments as follows: **Aylesbury Liberal Democrats support this proposed change.**

AAM - Aylesbury Oxford Road changes to **AAO** Aylesbury, Oxford Road and the Polling District is changed to match the Local Government Boundary Commission's final proposal for Walton Court for Aylesbury Town Council. Aylesbury Liberal Democrats comments as follows **Aylesbury Liberal Democrats propose that the ward is split into two polling districts - Prebendal Farm and Hartwell polling at the Community Centre in Somerville Way - and the part of Oxford Road Ward to the south of Oxford Road along Ellen Road polling at Southcourt community centre on Prebendal Avenue. It would bring the polling station closer and is geographically more appropriate for that part of the ward.**

AAN - Aylesbury Quarrendon No 1 Renamed to **AAP** Aylesbury, Quarrendon 1 with polling taking place in. Quarrendon & Meadowcroft Community Centre, Bowlers Field, Meadowcroft Road, Aylesbury, Bucks. HP19 9H

Aylesbury Liberal Democrats comments as follows:

We propose that AAP Aylesbury Quarrendon 1 is renamed to Aylesbury Quarrendon. Splitting the old Haydon Hill / Quarrendon Ward into two has made the numbering superfluous as there will only be one polling district in the town ward.

AAO - Aylesbury Quarrendon No.2 is renamed to **AAQ** Aylesbury, Quarrendon/Haydon Hill 1 and will also merge with current Polling District BEE to match the Boundary Commission for England's final proposals for parliamentary constituencies Haydon Hill Community Centre, 10 Dickens Way, Aylesbury, Bucks. HP19 8SR Aylesbury Liberal Democrats comments as follows:

We propose that AAQ Aylesbury, Quarrendon/Haydon Hill 1 is renamed to AAQ Aylesbury Haydon Hill 1. Splitting the old ward into two means that the Quarrendon reference is inappropriate in that the Quarrendon estate is on the other side of the A41 and none of the new Ward is in Quarrendon nor do the local people consider themselves to be part of that estate.

BEE - Quarrendon No.3 has been proposed to be changed to **AAR** Aylesbury, Quarrendon/Haydon Hill 2 as it will need to merge with current Polling District AAO to match the Boundary Commission for England's final proposals for parliamentary constituencies. Polling station is Haydon Hill Community Centre, 10 Dickens Way, Aylesbury, Bucks. HP19 8SR

Aylesbury Liberal Democrats comments as follows:

We propose that the reference to Quarrendon is removed in the naming of this polling district. The Quarrendon estate is on the other side of the A41 and none of the new Ward is in Quarrendon nor do the local people consider themselves to be part of that estate.

AAS - Aylesbury Walton Court is renamed to **AAW** Aylesbury, Walton Court. The new Polling District boundaries to match the Local Government Boundary Commission's final proposal for Oxford Road Ward, Hawkslade Ward and Walton Court Ward for Aylesbury Town Council. Polling stations will be Walton Court Community Centre, Walton Court Shopping Centre, Hannon Road, Aylesbury, Bucks. HP21 8TJ Aylesbury Liberal Democrats comments as follows:

Aylesbury Liberal Democrats support this proposed change.

ABH (NEW SPLIT) is being created as **ABY** Weston Turville, Aston Reach. This is to make sure the Polling District is set to match the Local Government Boundary Commission's final proposals for Weston Turville Village Ward and Aston Reach Ward for Weston Turville Parish Council. The Polling station will be in Weston Turville Village Hall, School Approach, Main Street, Weston Turville, Bucks. HP22 5RW Aylesbury Liberal Democrats comments as follows:

We suggest relocating the polling station to a closer venue instead of Weston Turville Village Hall. The hall is currently over a mile and a half away, and there are limited transportation options for voters. The Oakfield Scout Hut is the closest alternative, but both Bedgrove polling stations are even closer. This adjustment aligns with the upcoming change where the district will be part of the Aylesbury East unitary ward in the next election, making it a more logical choice.

BEC - Provis Wharf Aylesbury, Oakfield will be removed. The current Polling Districts **BEC** and AAL merge since they are both now within the same parliamentary constituency boundaries and have the same Polling Place Oakfield Scout Hut, Oakfield Road, Aylesbury, Bucks. HP20 1L

Aylesbury Liberal Democrats comments as follows:

Aylesbury Liberal Democrats support this proposed change.

ABC - Stoke MandevilleStoke Leys that is renamed to **ABV** Stoke Mandeville, Stoke Leys 1 and proposed polling station at Hawkslade Farm Community Centre, Orwell Drive, Aylesbury, Bucks.HP21 9YL

AND

ABD (NEW SPLIT) that will be creating **DCG** Stoke Mandeville, Stoke Leys 2 Polling District to match the Local Government Boundary Commission's final proposals for Stoke Mandeville Village Ward and Stoke Leys Ward for Stoke Mandeville Parish Council which has a proposed New Polling Place as Stoke Mandeville Community Centre, Eskdale Road, Stoke Mandeville, HP22 5UJ

Aylesbury Liberal Democrats comments as follows:

Aylesbury Liberal Democrats propose consolidating the polling stations for these two districts into a single location, either at Hawkslade Farm Community Centre or Stoke Mandeville Community Centre. The Parish ward spans two constituencies, necessitating two polling districts. Currently, the polling stations are 2.4 miles apart. In the event that a voter mistakenly goes to the wrong station, such as when receiving a ride from a neighbour, having both polling stations at the same location would ensure they can still cast their vote.

As this has been previously agreed I am not sure why it is not still part of the present proposals.
- 2. Micklefield historically has low turnout and it is notable it has always only had one polling station. The addition of Hicks Farm Rise would resolve this.
- 3. It would make sense for residents of Pimms Grove, Pimms Close, Cock Lane and Olympic Way to vote at Wrights Meadow Centre, as they need to drive past it to vote at Micklefield Community Centre.

Code EBS Totteridge and Bowerdean 3 'New Polling Place'. This is not new at all as it was used in 2021. This needs to be replaced by the tried and tested Hannah Ball School which is convenient for the large swathe of pensioners resident in lower Bowerdean. Residents who want to cast their vote do not want to walk up to the Hive again. They know Hannah Ball School as a polling station for a very long time. This will have the benefit of preventing the Hive becoming the new polling centre of mayhem that the Community Centre became.

In my view, an error was made in 2021 dropping Hannah Ball and pushing voters back up the hill towards Hive and Community Centre.
