Welcome from the Community Board



#### Role of the Board

- Support the Council's strategic priorities at a local level through delivery and, where appropriate, funding of local projects and initiatives.
- Identify and agree local priorities based on local data and insight, community intelligence and feedback from their community to create a local action plan.
- Make recommendations on the allocation of their Community Board funding to deliver agreed local priorities (aligned with Buckinghamshire Council policy and priorities).



#### **Collaboration**

- Working with all our Council services, partners, organisations, community groups and local people is key to the success of Community Boards and making a real difference to our communities.
- The aim of the Boards is shared by many of our public sector, voluntary and community sector partners who also want to understand local issues and what matters to communities the most.
- Buckinghamshire Council is committed to partnership working, focusing on shared priorities, and encouraging collaboration, sharing intelligence, driving change, and tackling key issues together.



#### **Funding to support addressing our priorities**

- Community Board Project funding is available to the value of £15,000 which clearly supports the
  priorities agreed by the Board.
  - Contributory funding required
- Small Grants Scheme funding is for small projects up to a value of £1,000

#### **Funding Criteria**

- The Community Board's remit does not cover services normally provided by the council's statutory duty.
- The Community Board is a facilitator for projects that could supplement or offer initiatives not provided by the council.




