**Title:** Buckinghamshire Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan [LCWIP]

The Council consulted on the draft Buckinghamshire Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP) between 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2024 and 13<sup>th</sup> October 2024.

The Buckinghamshire LCWIP proposes a future network of 'corridors' for walking, cycling and wheeling between towns and villages across Buckinghamshire, presented as indicative straight lines. These 'corridors' have been identified through data analysis and engagement with local councillors and Community Boards. The consultation invited feedback on the proposals, for example, asking, have we included the right priorities or are there are other important connections you think should be considered?

During the consultation period, the Council welcomed comments from the LAF. The deadline for comments has ended, but this meeting provides an opportunity to summarise and discuss comments made by member organisations during the consultation.

We are currently considering the responses received. We will then make any necessary changes to the draft Buckinghamshire LCWIP. It is anticipated this will be presented to the Council's Cabinet for approval and adoption in 2025. Once adopted, the Buckinghamshire LCWIP will be integrated into other policies and strategies and used to prioritise future investment.

Proposals identified in the Buckinghamshire LCWIP will be subject to further development, engagement and public consultation, if or when they are taken forward as individual projects.
